Entering the high school, she felt like her readiness was developed by her middle school teacher, Ms. Sue Quale. Simone shared a classroom experience of watching Ms. Quale take a chunk of clay to sculpt a dog in minutes. Simone was inspired by the great sense of independence Ms. Quale shared personally, "Ms. Quale cared about you - not what others thought."
