Information available through this secure website includes: assignment and gradebook information, student schedules, attendance, conduct, lunch account payments/purchases/balance, and contact information.

Food Service Program

Information pertaining to the food service program is outlined below. You can also access the information on our website at <u>www.rvschools.org</u> under "Food Services". Breakfast and lunch menus are printed in the Home News every week, and a monthly menu is also available on our website.

The River Valley School District uses an automated food service system where families prepay into an account and students "spend" the money as they use the food service program each day.

Parents should send one check for all members of the family using the food service program. For security precautions, use of checks instead of cash is strongly encouraged.

Account payments should be mailed or brought to <u>Gwen</u> <u>Gorman at the River Valley District Office</u>.

Families may also choose to make payments online. Not only will you have the ability to have payments electronically withdrawn from your checking account or charged to your credit card, you also have the flexibility to make a payment at any time through the school website.

To set up online payments:

- 1. Visit <u>www.rvschools.org</u>
- 2. Select Food Services
- 3. Select E-funds/Check Your Lunch Account Balance Online

You can also request to get an email notification if your account balance drops below \$7.00. Once in Family Access, select the Email Notifications link and then Change My Notifications.

Ala carte options may be available with prices ranging from \$.50 to \$2.50.

ELIGIBILITY FOR FREE & REDUCED PRICE MEALS

Free and Reduced forms are available on our website under Food Service Forms and in every school office. **A new application must be submitted every year**, to <u>Gwen Gorman</u> <u>at the River Valley District Office</u>. Please contact Gwen Gorman at 588.2551 or <u>ggorman@rvschools.org</u> if you have questions about how to apply for free and reduced meals.

PLEASE NOTE: If your family qualifies for Free & Reduced lunch, you will still need to fund your student(s) lunch account for any ala carte purchases (ie: extra serving of main entrée, additional milk, etc.) as these are not included in the free & reduced plan.



STUDENT USE OF FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM

Students use a four-digit code when going through the breakfast/lunch line. As an added security measure, the student's photo will appear on the screen after the code is entered, thereby preventing a student from using another student's code.

The computer will automatically deduct the amount for the breakfast or lunch from the family account. Parents may choose to block access to ala cart. When your family balance goes below \$7.00, parents will be notified by phone or email.

Ala carte items will not be sold to those with a \$0 balance. A complete record of each student's purchases is available upon request.

Counseling Services

Please feel free to call or email Mrs. Lochner, Middle School Counselor, if you have any questions or concerns regarding the school year. If you <u>do not</u> wish for your child to participate in individual or group counseling during the school year, please submit this request in writing.

Assignment Notebooks

On the first day of school your child will receive their assignment notebook, which is to be used through the school year to keep track of assignments, important dates, and serves as a hallway pass.

Please read the academic and behavioral guidelines with your son or daughter. When finished, please sign and date the acknowledgement page and turn it in to your



student's homeroom teacher. During the first week of school, students will meet with their homeroom teacher to discuss and clarify all of the book's contents.

All students are required to take their assignment notebooks to every class and write down homework information. There are also pass pages in the assignment notebook, intended to replace traditional hallway passes.

No pages should be torn from the assignment notebook, nor should the covers be removed or defaced.
