## Periods of Exclusion from School with Infectious Conditions

Personal hygiene measures such as hand washing, covering the mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing, covering weeping sores, not sharing food or drinks, and not attending school when ill or suffering from diarrhea are important means of limiting the transmission of a number of common infectious conditions.

The student/staff who have been in contact with the following conditions, to be excluded from school for the periods specified.

For the purposes of these guidelines, communicable diseases include, but are not limited to, the following:

Condition	Criteria for Exclusion from School	Onsite control and prevention measures
Mumps	Exclude for 5 days after swelling onset.	Provide immunization records for exposed individuals to public health officials Good handwashing and hygiene. Avoid kissing, sharing drinks, or utensils, use proper disinfection of surfaces and toys.
Pink Eye	None, unless fever, behavior change, or unable to avoid touching the eye. Antibiotics not required for return	Good handwashing and hygiene. Avoid kissing, sharing drinks, or utensils, use proper disinfection of surfaces and toys.
Strep Throat	Exclude for 24 hours after initiation of appropriate antibiotic and fever resolved. Fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours	Avoid kissing, sharing drinks, or utensils; exclude infected food handlers; minimize contact with respiratory and oral secretions. Good handwashing and hygiene.
Influenza	Exclude until fever resolved for 24 hours Fever free without fever reducing	Handwashing and good personal hygiene including covering coughs and sneezes.

Pertussis (whooping cough)	Exclude until after 5 days of antibiotic treatment; if no antibiotic treatment, exclude 21 days after cough onset	Refer symptomatic individuals to health care provider for evaluation. Handwashing and good personal hygiene including covering coughs and sneezes
Diarrhea	Exclude until asymptomatic for 24 hours.	3 or more loose stools in 24 hours. Outbreaks of diarrhea in group settings are reportable to the public health department. Good handwashing and hygiene; proper disinfection of tables, toys, and food preparation areas.
Gastroenteritis (viral)	Exclude until asymptomatic for 24 hours for rotavirus and 48 hours with norovirus	Good handwashing and hygiene; proper disinfection of tables, toys, and food preparation areas. Alcohol based hand products are not effective. Soap and water must be used.
Hepatitis A Virus	Exclude for 14 days after onset of symptoms or 10 days after onset of jaundice.	Consider Hepatitis A vaccine. Exposed staff should not prepare meals for others. Good handwashing and hygiene; proper disinfection of tables, toys, and food preparation areas.
Pinworm Infection	None, unless has diarrhea.	Frequent, good handwashing, particularly by infected child and staff assisting in toileting; keep fingernails clean and short; prevent fingers in mouth.
Clostridium Difficile Infection (c.diff)	Exclude until asymptomatic for 48 hours.	Good handwashing and hygiene; proper disinfection of tables, toys, and food preparation areas. Alcohol based hand products are not effective. Soap and water must be used
Fifth Disease	None	Good handwashing and hygiene; proper disinfection of changing tables, surfaces, and toys.
Hand-foot-and – mouth disease	None, unless fever present or child maintain hygiene or avoid close contact with others. Lesions must be scab over before return. Fever free without fever reducing medication for 24 hours	Good handwashing and hygiene; proper disinfection of changing tables, surfaces, and toys.
