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BALLOT LANGUAGE – QUESTION 1

Brief Description: Capital referendum for building and remodeling at all three buildings

Actual Wording: Shall the River Valley School District, Sauk, Iowa, Richland and Dane Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$19,500,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and facility improvement project consisting of: renovations at the Elementary, Middle and High Schools; construction of safe and secure entrances/offices at the Elementary and Middle Schools; construction of an addition for a replacement gymnasium at the Middle School, to create a single River Valley School District campus; building infrastructure, site improvements, ADA accessibility updates and other associated work; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?



BALLOT LANGUAGE – QUESTION 2

Brief Description: Capital referendum for additions and renovations performing arts spaces

Actual Wording: Shall the River Valley School District, Sauk, Iowa, Richland and Dane Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$14,500,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building project at the High School consisting of: construction of a performing arts center addition and a safe and secure entrance; remodeling and ADA compliance updates, including to the performing arts commons and stage areas; site improvements and other associated work; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?
