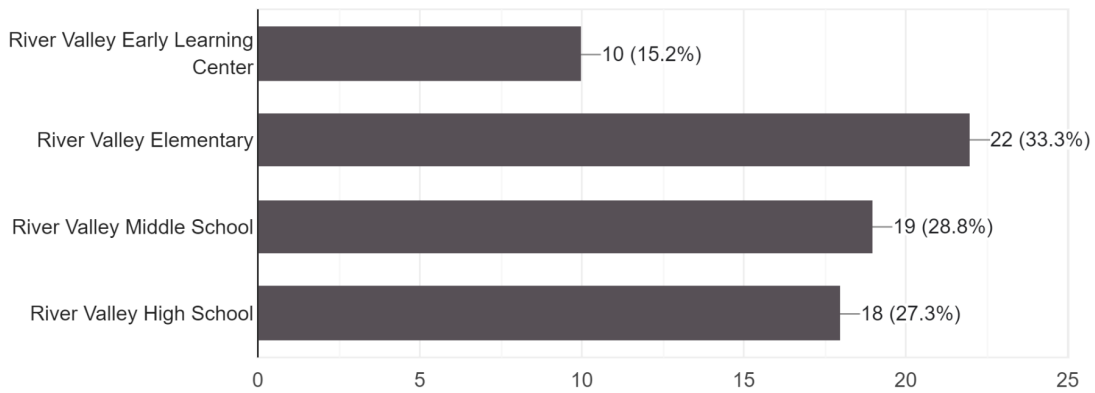


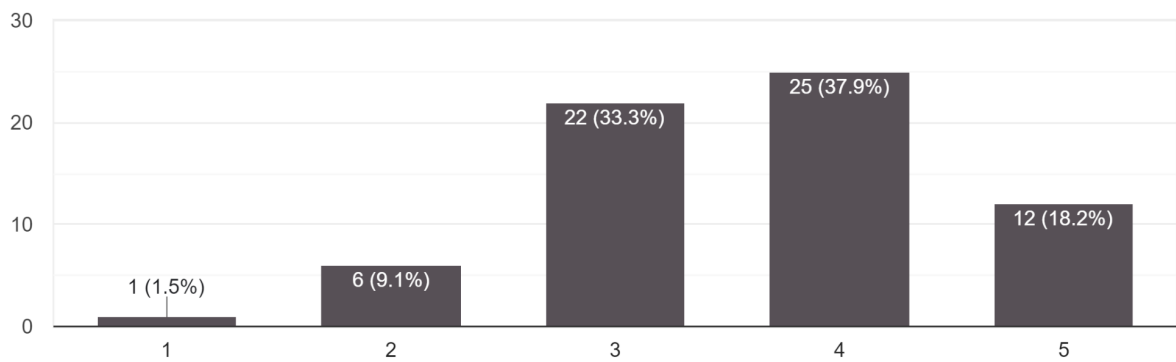

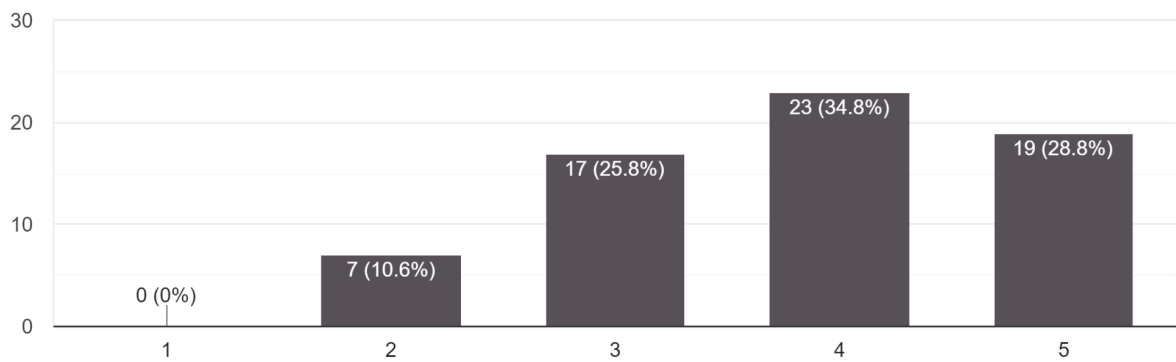
How would you rate your overall satisfaction level with your school?

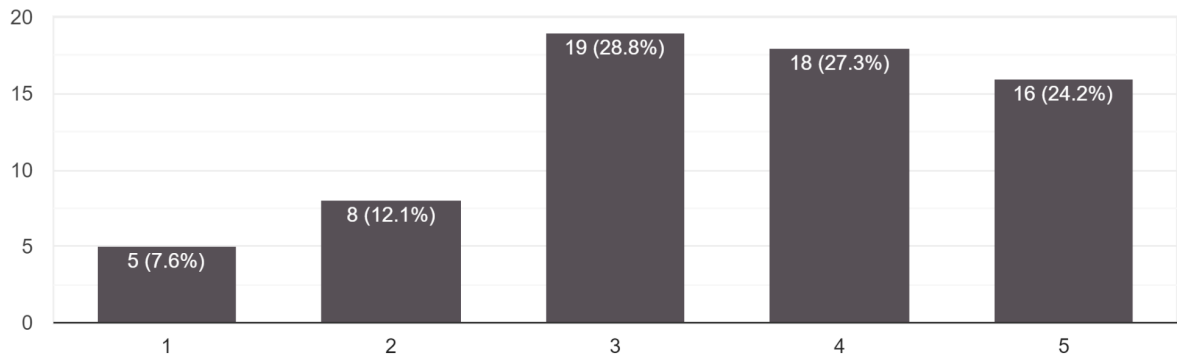
I feel safe at school.

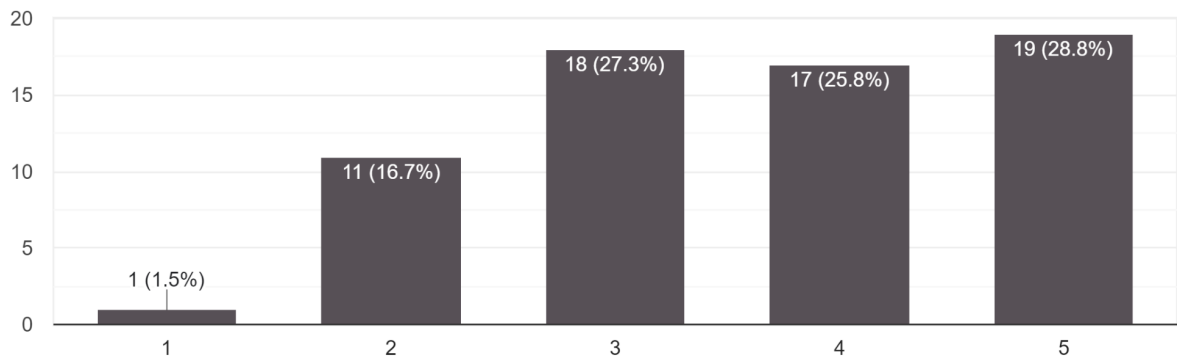

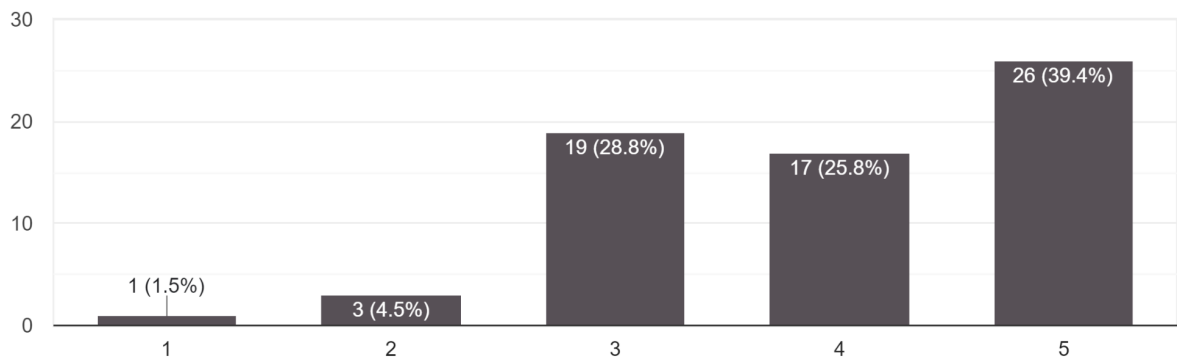

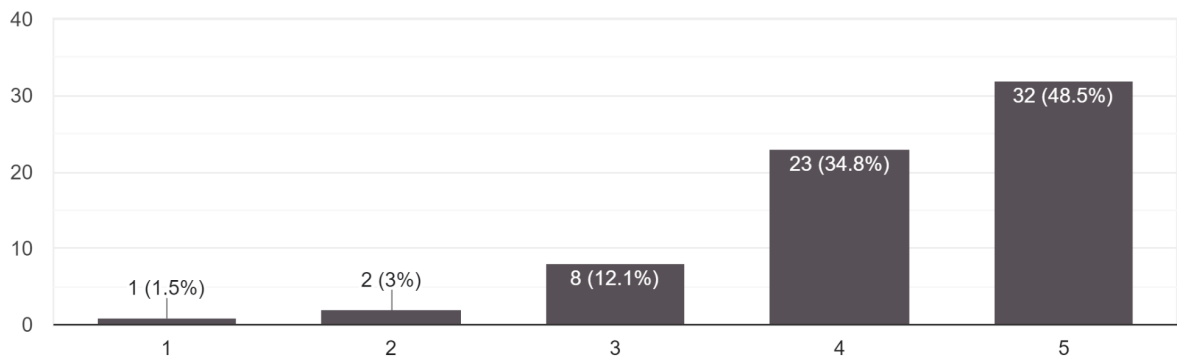

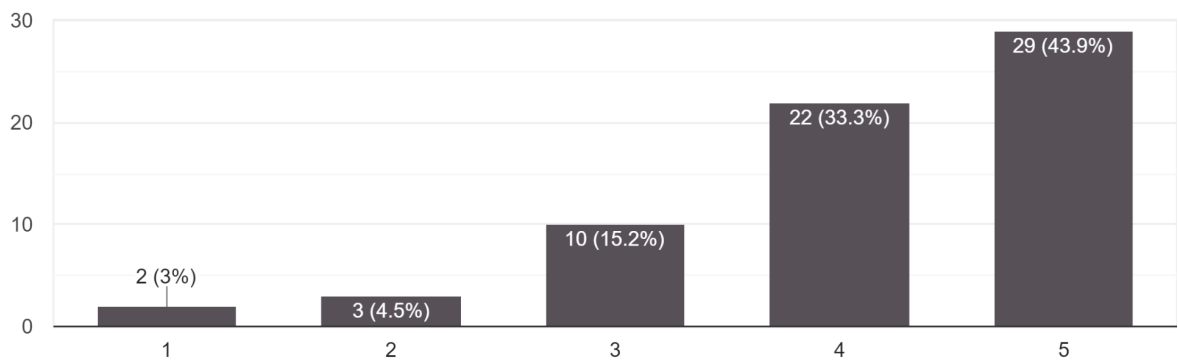

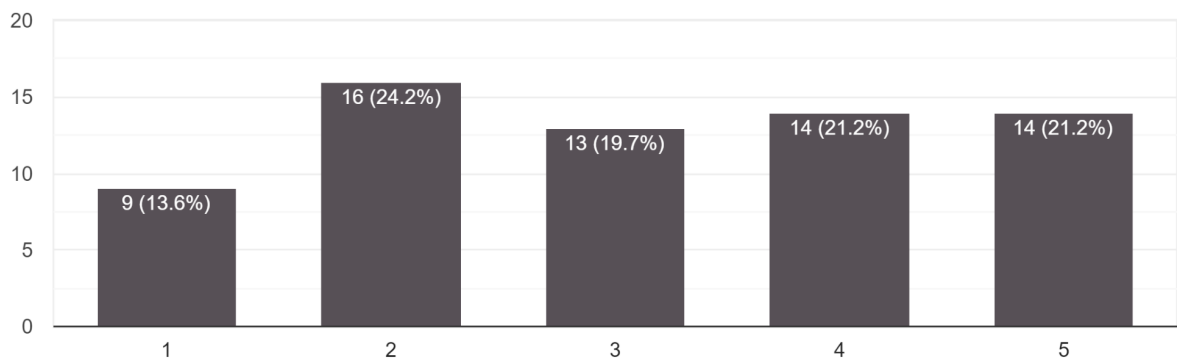

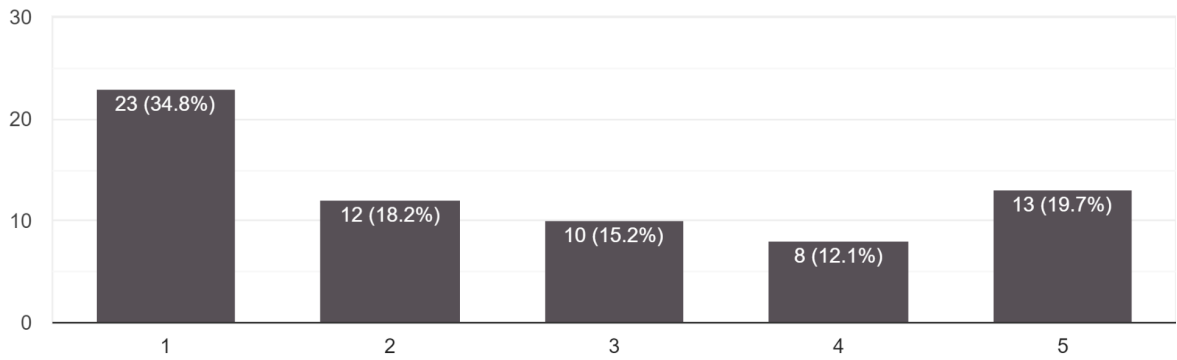

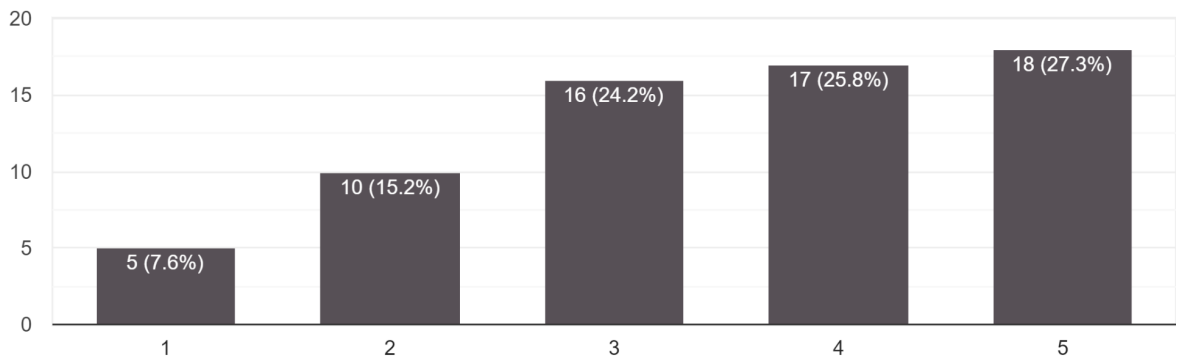

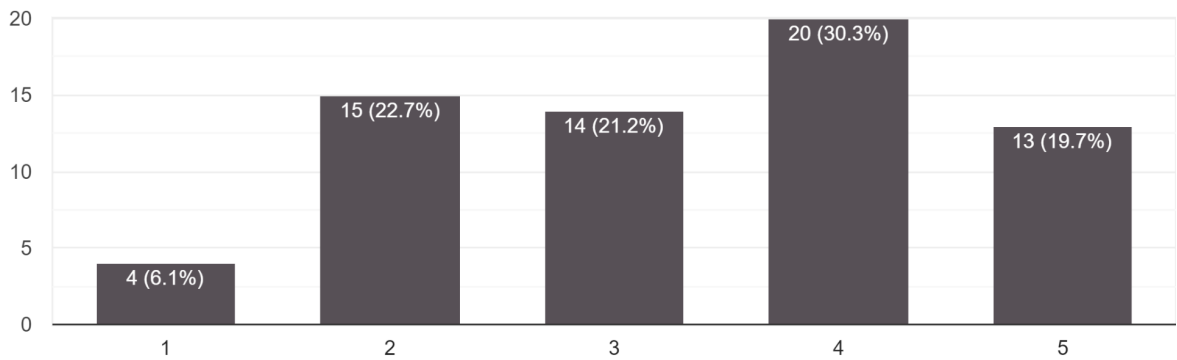

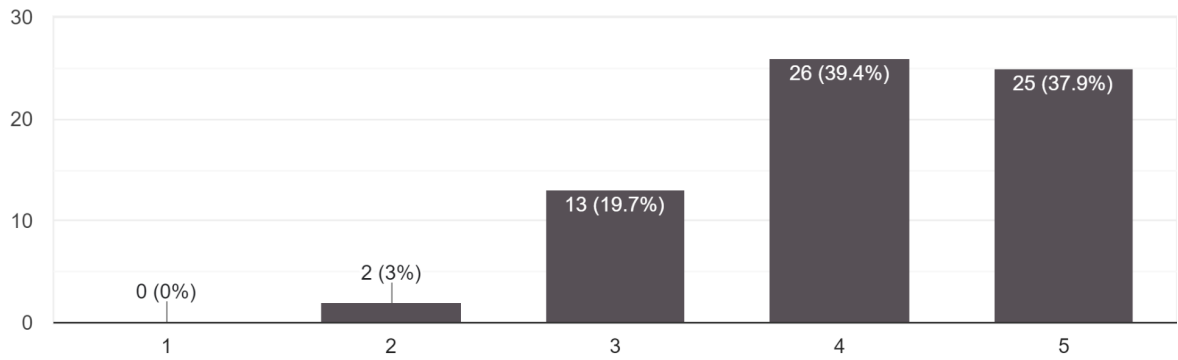

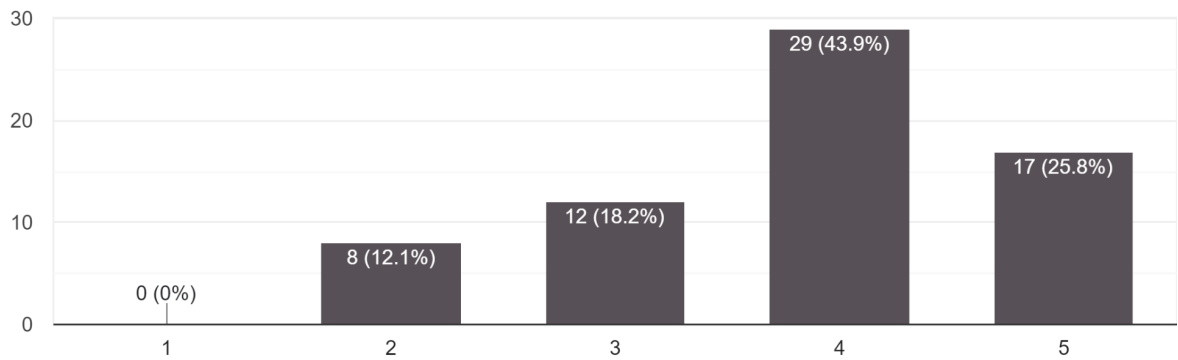

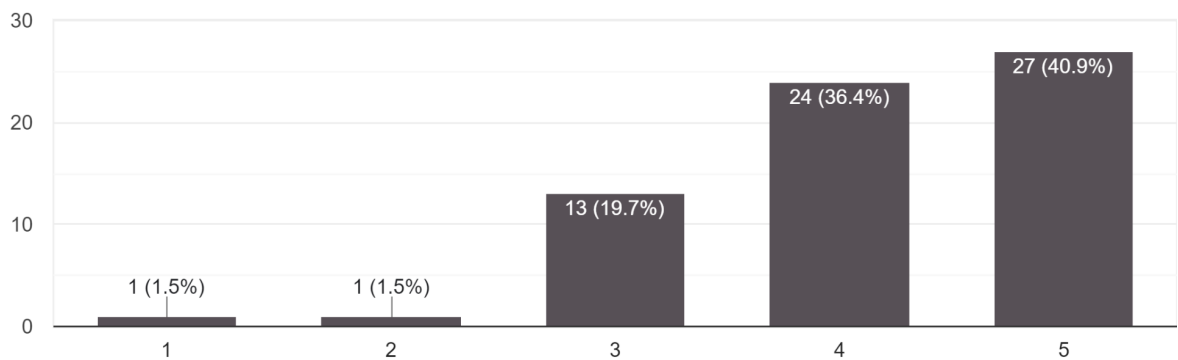

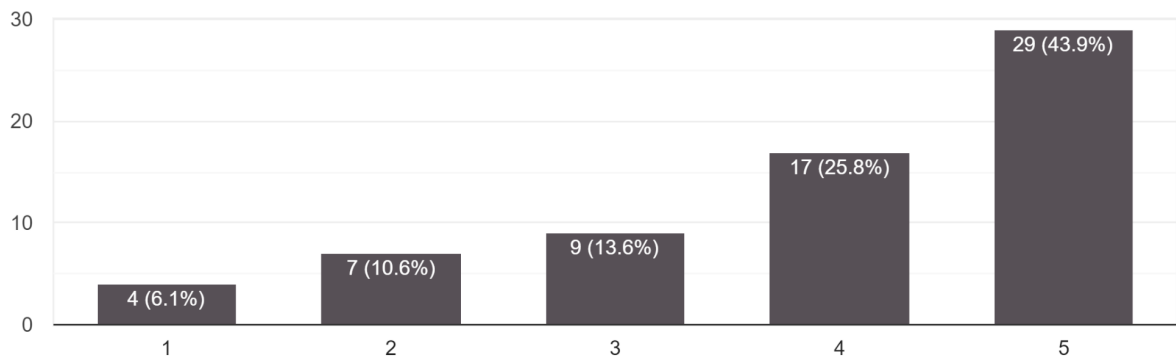

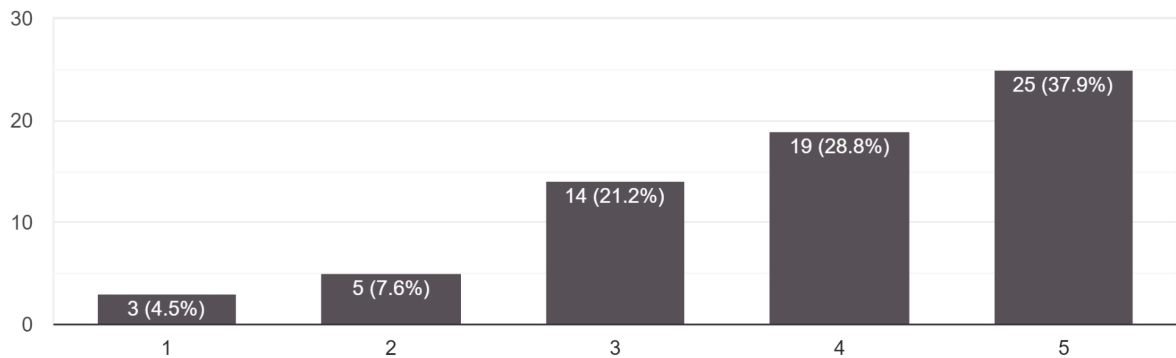
