
## Q1 In which community do you reside?







## Q2 What is your age?




## Q3 Did you vote on April 2nd?


# Q4 On Question 1 (\$19.5 million for school facility improvement projects across the district), how did you vote?




# Q6 On Question 2 (\$14.5 million for a performing arts center at the high school), how did you vote?


