- I. Reasonable mitigation of risk that is within our capacity to accomplish to provide a safe learning environment for our students and staff
  - a. Implementing recommendations from CDC, DHS and DPI of preventative measures for the health and safety of all
  - b. Education with parents, staff and students of plan and preventative measures

All health organizations at each level recommend:

- Social Distancing
- Masking
- Personal Hygiene
- c. Education with students and staff of daily preventative practices:
  - sanitizing plan
  - social distancing plan
  - screening students and staff
  - scheduling plan
  - masking
  - meal plan
  - transportation plan
  - monitoring healthy hygiene procedures

## II. Provide instruction that meets the essential standards for each grade level

- a. Scheduling
- b. Standards with lessons (face-to-face and virtual)
- c. Assessment/remedial plan

### III. Prepare for and address instruction that may be virtual or blended

- a. Staff development (focused on virtual delivery)
- b. Learning Management Plan
- c. Lesson planning that meets the standards
- d. Scheduling
- e. Providing lessons both face-to-face and virtual
