

Referendum Overview

- The River Valley School District is asking voters for <u>continued tax funding</u> over the next 3 years to maintain existing educational courses, programs, services, and moderate class sizes.
- These funds are **<u>not</u>** for new buildings or facilities.
- Ballot language for April 1, 2025 Shall the River Valley School District, Sauk, Iowa, Richland and Dane Counties, Wisconsin, be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$4,150,000 for the 2025-2026 school year, by \$4,750,000 for the 2026-2027 school year, and by \$5,200,000 for the 2027-2028 school year for non-recurring purposes consisting of paying the costs of maintaining educational programs and maintenance of the District?

Even with rising prices due to inflation, the District has kept its spending increases to an average of just 1.90% per year over the last decade.

River Valley continues to decrease staffing as student enrollment declines.

Per State Statute, the River Valley School District is not allowed to advocate for or against a referendum.

Why does River Valley need an operational referendum?

• Prior Referendums

- The River Valley community **passed 3-year operational referendums in 2019 and again in 2022** to preserve existing programs, courses, services, and manageable class sizes.
 - The 2022 operational referendum expires at the end of this school year.

<u>Cost Reductions</u>

- At the end of this school year, **River Valley will close the Early Learning Center** in Plain. All students will attend on the campus in Spring Green.
 - Moving to a 3-building configuration increases efficiencies throughout the District and saves \$1,000,000 annually.
 - These savings help reduce the amount needed for the operational referendum, however this only covers a portion of our projected deficits.

• State Funding Formula

• **Despite significant cuts** made to the district budget over the last decade, the **state funding formula isn't enough** to maintain existing programs, courses, services and class sizes offered to students.


How much will the operational referendum cost?

In order to maintain existing programs, courses, services, and class sizes, River Valley needs to close a funding gap of \$14.1 million over three years.

What happens if this operational referendum fails?

If the April 2025 referendum does not pass, the district will move forward into the 2025-26 school year. However, doing so would leave the district in a financially fragile position.

Looking ahead, the District would need to put an operational referendum on the ballot in April 2026 and could be forced to make substantial budget reductions. These reductions would impact course offerings, programs, services, class sizes and other essential areas that contribute to the success of our schools.

As the District navigates this process, we will continue to provide updates and opportunities for community engagement. We encourage all residents to stay informed, ask questions, and participate in the discussions that will shape the future of our schools.
